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I. Job Summary

Under the general direction of the Director of Operations, assesses patients, develops optimal radiologic techniques or plans, and evaluates resulting radiographic images.

Radiologic Technologists will strive to continually improve patient satisfaction and exceed expectations for service.

II. Essential Job Responsibilities

Reviews and executes physician and mid-level orders for radiographic services; clarifying instructions if unclear or patient unable to comply.

Courteously receives patients and clearly communicates tests to be done as well as patient position needed in order to obtain image.

Reviews images prior to patient departure to ensure quality.

Conducts quality control on x-ray equipment and maintains logs.

Responds to all regulatory inquiries and inspections in conjunction with CEO.

Attends staff meetings and provides constructive ideas to improve quality of treatment, patient education and efficiency of clinic.

Contributes to the safe environment of patients and staff including notifying persons if equipment needs to be repaired or is broken, utilizing personal protective equipment and good infection control practices.

Maintains current state of Georgia license.

Complies with all applicable state and federal regulations.

III. Other Job Responsibilities

Performs other related duties as assigned.
